CRITICAL INCIDENT DEBRIEF

THE COVENANT SCHOOL TRAGEDY: THE NASHVILLE MASS SHOOTING EVENT FROM THE OFFICER'S PERSPECTIVE

The second section walks through the timeline from the moment the first call was received until the threat was neutralized. The third section focuses on the lessons learned from the incident, highlighting both the positives and the areas for improvement. LAW ENFORCEMENT PROTECTIVE SECURITY OPERATIONS

Tom Wynn, (DHS HSI (Ret.) / Roger "Doc" Penna, Wynn Solutions Group, Inc. / Karla Stowe, Crisp Co Sheriff's Office

The Law Enforcement Protective Security Operations seminar is designed to familiarize participants with the fundamental principles and concepts of protective operation missions. It addresses the critical need for formal training among law enforcement officers who frequently undertake these essential missions. This 4-hour seminar offers an introductory overview with a focus on the comprehensive 5-day Law Enforcement Protective Security Operations Training Program (LE-PSOTP). The program is based on proven methodologies used by the U.S. Secret Service and the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Diplomatic Security Service. Key topics covered include Introduction to Protective Operations for LE; Protective Security Formations; Motorcade Operations (Arrival/Departure); Attack on Principal Drills; Threat Identification and Mitigation; and Protective Agent Course of Fire.

STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: JACKET - A BDU-TYPE SHIRT OR BLOUSE IS SUFFICIENT; HANDGUN WITH (75) ROUNDS OF AMMO); BELT-TYPE HOLSTER (EITHER INSIDE THE WAISTBAND (IWB) OR OUTSIDE THE WAISTBAND HOLSTER (OWB) – SHOULD BE CONCEALED – **NO THIGH HOLSTERS**; EYE AND EAR PROTECTION; AND WATER TO STAY HYDRATED. WEAPONS AND PROTECTIVE SECURITY EQUIPMENT MUST REMAIN CONCEALED DURING THIS TRAINING COURSE.

MECHANICAL BREACHING WORKSHOP

Robert Cole, Team One Network

The breacher, like all other specialty team members, must be given the training that ensures he/she is proficient and therefore successful during actual operations. The primary objective of this program is to provide students with a working knowledge of manual breaching tools and techniques. This course will address manual breaching, power and hydraulic-assisted tools, as well as shotgun breaching rounds. <u>Outcomes:</u> describe types of doors and windows and their construction; understand strike points and tools for various type of doors; understand break and rake techniques for various window types and equipment; understand the principles of prying techniques and equipment; understand the principles of prying techniques and equipment; and understand the principles of power assisted/hydraulic techniques and equipment.

STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: TEAM ONE NETWORK WILL PROVIDE BREACHING DOORS AND A VARIETY OF BREACHING TOOLS. STUDENTS ARE WELCOME TO USE THEIR OWN TOOLS IF THEY WANT TO.

RIFLE SKILL BUILDER

<u> Isaac Lopez / Joanna Fricke, SIG SAUER</u>

The SWAT Rifle course increases the operator's handling skills with the patrol rifle. Drills are designed to improve the operator's proficiency and handling capabilities using reduced time limits and hit zones. Students will be tested throughout the course using performance-based training drills (i.e., static shooting drills, positional shooting; shooting on the move, reloads and malfunction drills, transition to pistol and wounded officer reload techniques).

STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: ESTIMATED ROUND COUNT: (400) RIFLE ROUNDS AND (100) HANDGUN ROUNDS; PATROL RIFLE WITH SLING AND (3) MAGAZINES; DUTY HANDGUN WITH (3) MAGAZINES MINIMUM; BELT MOUNTED HOLSTER OR DUTY RIG; MAGAZINE POUCHES; SUNSCREEN AND BUG SPRAY; HYDRATION SYSTEM; WRAPAROUND EYEWEAR (POLYCARBONATE LENSES OR NON-SHATTERING PRESCRIPTION GLASSES); EARMUFFS AND EARPLUGS; KNEE PADS; AND TAC VEST.

OFFICER RESCUE

William J. (BJ) Hall / Peter Roehrig / Brian Erb, Florida SWAT Association

This course will focus on the rescue of a downed officer/civilian and treatment. Students will be trained in advanced rescue techniques that can be used to perform a rescue in a high-risk environment and the treatment to increase the chance of survival of the downed officer/civilian. Students will be trained in an open field rescue, rescue from a vehicle, and rescue from a structure. During the training, we will teach the students how to extract an injured person from the point of injury using drag and carries, as well as other extraction devices (skeds, litters, etc.).

STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: TACTICAL UNIFORM, VEST, HELMET, GLOVES AND EYE PROTECTION. NO WEAPONS OR AMMO!

QUICK REACTION FORCE (QRF) / COMBAT RIFLE

QRF training will involve all live fire courses, which include deploying from vehicles, working through crowds and all aspects that a QRF team could face. These will be two to four-person teams that flow together in a common way to stop the threat. There will be a lot of moving targets and challenges that personnel would experience in a mass shooting situation. A very fluid and active course.

STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO BRING ALL WEAPONS SYSTEMS ISSUED TO THEM BY THEIR AGENCY WITH SUFFICIENT AMMUNITION TO CONDUCT FIREARMS TRAINING (FULL KIT – HANDGUNS (100 ROUNDS) – LONG GUNS (350 ROUNDS); EYE PROTECTION; EAR PROTECTION; HELMET; ENTRY/HEAVY VEST; AND WATER TO STAY HYDRATED.

RANGE ESTIMATION

STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: RIFLE WITH A SCOPE (MIL/MOA RETICLE); (40) ROUNDS OF AMMUNITION; EYE AND EAR PROTECTION; AND SHOOTING MAT/BAG.

RAPPELLING – LEARNING TECHNIQUES & BUILDING CONFIDENCE FOR SWAT TOWER SCRAMBLE EVENT

This class will provide knowledge and hands-on training that will enhance the student's confidence and skills needed for optimal performance during the rappelling portion of the Tower Scramble event.

STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: RAPPEL HARNESS; RAPPEL GLOVES; HELMET; RESCUE-EIGHT DESCENDER; AND (1) CARABINER (MINIMUM 27KN).

NOTE: ATTENDING STUDENTS ARE ENCOURAGED TO BRING THEIR COMPETITION ROPES FOR INSPECTION, AS WELL AS PROPER PRE-COMPETITION SET-UP.

RED DOT SIGHT PISTOL

This course is designed to enhance the shooter's abilities and skills with a red dot sight (RDS) equipped pistol. The course will cover basic shooting fundamentals, as well as red dot specific drills and malfunctions. The course will take on a student/coach approach, so students leave the training class with valuable information to take back to their teams. **STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: PISTOL WITH RDS (ZEROED) AND IRON SIGHTS; APPROPRIATE HOLSTER; MAGAZINE**

POUCH WITH MINIMUM OF (3) MAGAZINES; (350) ROUNDS OF HANDGUN AMMO; EYE AND EAR PROTECTION; TOURNIQUET, SHARPIE, NOTEPAD AND PEN. OPTIONAL EQUIPMENT TO ALSO BRING: ANOTHER RDS EQUIPPED PISTOL; LONG SLEEVE SHIRT; HAT; WATER BOTTLE; SNACKS; AND SUNSCREEN.

SPECIAL OPERATIONS COMBATIVES PROGRAM (SOCP) - John Kirkland, Orange County SO

SOCP (Special Operations Combatives Program) is a realism based, task-specific system designed to bridge the gap between foundational fight skills and the unique needs of the modern-day assaulter in the CQB environment. SOCP is the designated combatives program for all U.S. Army Special Operations Forces. ERB Codes: (SOCP I: BRT), (SOCP II: FBR) SOCP is now the standard program for fighting in kit and bridging the gap between CQB and combatives. SOCP is currently being implemented at Special Forces Units 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 10th, SWCS; Special Forces Advanced Skills Battalion; 75 Ranger Regiment; Marine RECON; MARSOC; Air Force SERE; Para Rescue and is spreading fast to other Special Units, FBI, ATF, Border Patrol and other Federal and State Law Enforcement, including Orange County Sheriff's Office SWAT, as well as Special Contract Units. SOCP Concepts: *Fighting in Kit with weaponry; *Weapon transition & retention standing or on ground; *360-degree ambush attacks into and over objects; *Fighting multiple assailants solo or as a team; *Compliant and non-compliant cuffing and vehicle extractions; *Force continuum (lethal/less-than-lethal options); and *Technique 'linkage'.

STACCATO 101 - Tim Roa, Staccato 2011

The Staccato 101 course is designed to improve both the operators and department's knowledge, proficiency and handling capabilities of the Staccato 2011 line of pistols through 2011 familiarization, dry fire and live fire drills. Drills conducted are designed to test the operator's accuracy, speed and processing of information (i.e., scored/timed drills while static and moving) within the demands of the SWAT high-risk mission set.

STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: PROPER RANGE ATTIRE; (300) ROUNDS OF 9MM AMMUNITION; DUTY BELT/RANGE BELT CAPABLE OF HANGING A T-SERIES HOLSTER FROM; PISTOL MAGAZINE POUCHES; SUNSCREEN; HYDRATION SYSTEM; BALLISTIC RATED/APPROVED EYE PROTECTION; AND HEARING PROTECTION (ELECTRONIC RECOMMENDED).

Staccato will provide (1) Staccato 2011 Pistol, (3) magazines and (1) Blackhawk T-Series L2 Duty Holster per student. Frangible Ammo will be provided by the instructors
